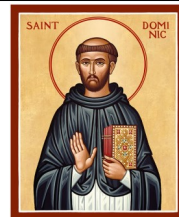

**SAINT DOMINIC  
FEAST DAY  
8TH AUGUST**



St Dominic (8 August 1170 - 6 August 1221), also known as Dominic de Guzman, was a Castilian Catholic priest founder of the Dominican Order and patron saint of astronomers. At fourteen he entered the University of Palencia in Castile, where for a decade he undertook secular and theological studies. Dominic immersed himself in Scripture, writing notes in the margins of his parchment copy of the Bible. But when famine struck Palencia, he sold all of his possessions, including his precious parchments and used the money to aid his starving neighbours. "I will not study on dead skins," he said, "when living skins are dying of hunger." In 1195 he became a canon of the cathedral at Osma and for nine years grew in prayer and spiritual fundamentals.

In 1204, Dominic accompanied Diego, the bishop of Osma, on a diplomatic mission that took them through Languedoc in south-east France, the base of the Albigensian heretics.

Dominic laid the groundwork for his strategic contribution to the church: communities of preachers and teachers who would revive the spiritual life of many Christians. And the secret of his effectiveness was his insistence on the basics. For example, contemporaries recorded the following observation about his practice and teaching on prayer.
