Easter Triduum

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the **Easter Triduum**: from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

These are the three most solemn days of the liturgical year; **Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil**. In these days, the Church celebrates the Paschal Mystery: first, the Passion and death of the Lord Jesus, followed by his resurrection, the triumph of the Holy Cross, and Christ's decisive victory over sin and death.

FROM THE FATHERS

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; blessed is the King of Israel

Let us go together to meet Christ on the Mount of Olives. Today he returns from Bethany and proceeds of his own free will towards his holy and blessed passion, to consummate the mystery of our salvation. He who came down from heaven to raise us from the depths of sin, to raise us with himself, we are told in Scripture, *above every sovereignty, authority and power, and every other name that can be named*, now comes of his own free will to make his journey to Jerusalem.
